Performers dance while playing drums, etc. wearing a large umbrella holding a flower.

They finally make sweets. Japanese dancers might be around 10 people and with Local participants, they will have a workshop. All costumes would be brought from Japan. Then both Japanese and Helsinki participants are making up a performance together.

Kyogen, which developed together with no, is often performed in the intervals between no plays. Dialogue is the central part of the comical performances. Both the kyogen stories and performances tend to be realistic and easy to understand.
