Remarks by Ambassador Murata at the Japan - Finland Gateway for Open Innovation Meetup on 20 November 2019

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen.

Thank you very much for this opportunity to speak. I am delighted to see so many of you taking time to join us. I would also like to thank JETRO for organizing this great event and our partners, Business Finland and Finland-Japan Chamber of Commerce for working together.

First, allow me to take this opportunity to extend my congratulations for the Finnish National Football team's historic victory last Friday and getting qualification for the European Championship 2020. I am excited to see further successes in the next summer. Congratulations!

As you may know, this year marks the 100th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Japan and Finland. Along with the memorial timing of our bilateral relations, we have seen many encouraging developments for Finland-Japan business recently. Just a couple of weeks ago, the Europe's largest MUJI flagship store newly opened in Kamppi with great excitement among both Finnish media and consumers. The enthusiastic warm welcome of the new Muji store in Finland shows our two countries share values on simple design and sustainability.

Back in February, Business Finland and JETRO signed an agreement to promote further international business collaboration. And not to mention, of course, the Japan-EU Economic Partnership Agreement also entered into force in February.

I sincerely hope that through this event, more and more Japanese and Finnish companies will find business partners, widen and strengthen their business connections as we head into the new century of Japan-Finland relations.
