Honoured Mr. Ambassador, Ladies and gentlemen,

First of all I would like to thank the organizers of the Tokyo Olympics and the Japanese state. Despite the difficult situation, they are not discouraged but are instead hosting the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Tokyo is a historic Paralympics city. The second Summer Paralympic Games ever were held in Tokyo in 1964. At that time, 266 athletes from twenty countries participated in the Paralympics.
