Address by Counsellor MIYAZAKI Kazumasa at the Opening of Finnish and Japanese Friendship Travelling Photo Exhibition on 7 June

Distinguished guests, ladies and gentlemen, Good afternoon.

I am Counsellor MIYAZAKI Kazumasa from the Embassy of Japan in Finland. Allow me to express my sincere appreciation for your joining the opening of this photo exhibition. I would like to thank Mr. Jukka Kosonen, Chair of Association of Finnish Camera Clubs, Ms. Anu Kasnio, Museum Director of Kouvola Art Museum, Ms. Anne Käki, Head of Connections for the City of Kouvola, and Ms. Marjo Seki, Friend of Japan, for making this exhibition possible here in Kouvola. Thank you.

It is my first time to visit Kouvola. As Covid-19 situation has calmed down, I am very happy to be able to meet you all. As the Finnish and Japanese Friendship Photo Exhibition travels around Finland, the friendship between our countries is not limited only to the metropolitan area, but can be found in many places and since a very long time ago. One remarkable example of this friendship is the friendship between Erik Laxman and Daikokuya Kodayu which dates back to over 200 years ago.
